## Grass and Legume Seed Market Update - April 29, 2011

Note: prices provided are normally given as grower prices, quoted by processors to growers after cleaning and dockage. However, with quotes now not being offered by many companies, last quotes may be provided.

With spring now upon us, activity in the grass and legume seed sector has become busier. Processors in the Peace are reporting receiving many inquiries regarding spring retail seed sales. As well, seed movement, although not large, has kept plants busy. Prices are also starting to strengthen.

Creeping red fescue quotes have moved into a range from 35  $\phi$ /lb to 40  $\phi$ /lb, with fall prices around 40  $\phi$ /lb. Acres of Canadian creeping red fescue will be down substantially this upcoming year, and with old inventory being moved, future supplies will be lacking. Processors are looking at this scenario and making management decisions accordingly. With Europe now in the buying mode for certified Boreal creeping red fescue, prices have strengthened to the 45 to 48  $\phi$ /lb range.

Common smooth bromegrass seed quotes have moved sideways, and are still quoted in the 60 to 70 ¢/lb range, with certified Carlton in the 70 - 80 ¢/lb range. Meadow bromegrass quotes have strengthened to the 75 - 85 ¢/lb range for common, while certified Fleet meadow brome have now been quoted in the \$1.00 to \$1.15/lb range. Demand for timothy seed has also improved, with common now at 45 to 48 ¢/lb, and with a lack of certified production last year, certified Climax has been quoted in the 55 to 65 ¢/lb range.

Common alfalfa seed quotes have moved up to the \$1.30 to \$1.45/lb range, while Red clover quotes remain in the 60-70  $\phi$ /lb range. Demand for Alsike clover has picked up, pushing quotes into the 75 – 95  $\phi$ /lb range. Sweet clover, if anyone has any, has now backed off back into the 65 to 85  $\phi$ /lb range.

Yesterday's (April 26, 2011) Statscan cereals and oilseeds seeding intention report showed an increase in acres across the prairies of over 9.5 million acres. No doubt, some of this increased acreage will come from grass and legume seed acres. Not good on the future supply side, but if demand holds or continues to build, could prove good news for growers.
